WHAT IS FENTANYL

Fentanyl is a very strong synthetic opioid. Fentanyl is 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine. It only takes 2mg, equivalent to grains of salt to be fatal.

Fentanyl is being found in FAKE pills made to look like percocet, oxycodone, and xanax, for example. It is laced in other drugs like cocaine, meth, heroin and even marijuana. The user is deceived believing they are using one thing and dying from fatal doses of Fentanyl.
